KLRCA Fast Track Rules 2010

Consumers of dispute resolution, and in particular international consumers, are increasingly demanding that their disputes be resolved efficiently, effectively and with a minimum of management time and legal costs. This legitimate demand has resulted in a number of new forms of alternative dispute resolution techniques being adopted from industry to industry and in different countries throughout the world. It has also meant that arbitral institutions have introduced new rules to streamline the procedures that had been used traditionally in arbitrations. The Fast Track Rules are KLRCA's new rules to meet the demands of consumers.

The session will consider the practical impact of the KLRCA's Fast Track Rules from the perspective of the claimant and the respondent as well as the arbitrator. There will also be key insights in what is involved in fast track arbitrations and other forms of dispute resolution which impose fast procedures on the parties.

The aim of the session is to introduce and provide a practical commentary on the **KLRCA Fast Track Rules 2010**.

The **KLRCA Fast Track Rules** were designed to help settle commercial disputes within 90 to 140 days. The rules apply to disputed amounts of up to RM1 million.

The key advantage of using the KLRCA Fast Track Rules is that commercial disputes can be settled quickly and amicably without the traditional complexities of a full arbitration hearing while saving costs for the parties involved due to the competitive fixed fee structures.
