# About the Speakers

**Mr Sundra Rajoo** is the Director of the Kuala Lumpur Regional Centre for Arbitration (KLRC). He was also recently appointed the President of the Asia Pacific Regional Arbitration Group (APRAG), which is a federation of 30 over arbitral institutions in the Asia Pacific region. He is a Chartered Arbitrator and an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya (non-practising), and had earlier practised as an Architect and Town Planner. He has been appointed as chairman, co-arbitrator of three-man panels and sole arbitrator in international and domestic arbitrations. He serves on the panel of numerous international arbitral institutions and organisations and is also a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators, Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and Indian Council of Arbitration.

**Tan Sri Dato' Cecil Abraham**, Senior Partner with Zul Rafique & Partners, is a Barrister-At-Law of the Middle Temple and is a Bencher of the Inn. He is a graduate of Queen Mary College, University of London. He is a Chartered Arbitrator and a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators U.K., Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators, Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and the Australian Centre for International Commercial Arbitration Limited. He has been involved as Arbitrator and Counsel in more than 100 arbitrations under the ICC, SIAC, KLRCA, LCIA and ICSID Rules and also in Ad Hoc arbitrations. He is a Member of the ICSID panel. He has represented the Government of Malaysia in an ICSID arbitration and is presently involved in annulment proceedings under the ICSID Convention. He is also a Member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration. He was a former Member of the LCIA Court.

**Mr Lim Chee Wee** is the current President of the Malaysia Bar. He is also a member of INSOL International (and its Membership Committee), an international association of restructuring, insolvency and bankruptcy professionals.
