VINCE SEE ENG TEONG

Dr. Vince is no stranger to the aviation industry. He holds an LL.M. degree in Air & Space Law from the Institute of Air & Space Law ("IASL"), McGill University, Montreal, Canada—the first and only Malaysian to hold that degree. The IASL is the world's first institute to specialize in Air & Space Law, having been established in 1946, almost as soon as the establishment of the International Civil Aviation Organisation ("ICAO"), which is also located in Montreal. Dr. Vince was granted a Law Faculty Fellowship by the IASL to support his pursuit of the LL.M. study. Air & Space Law degree aside, Dr. Vince used to work as General Counsel in the airlines industry. In his Aviation Law Practice, he has advised various stakeholders in the aviation industry, including an international aviation communications industry player. He has authored a number of articles on Air & Space Laws that are published in international law journals, including the US Journal of Transportation Law Logistics and Policy, Journal of Air Law & Commerce, and German Air & Space Law Journal (*ZLW*), and a book chapter on the implementation of the Cape Town Convention in Malaysia.

Outline of topic:

The Talk will attempt to cover both the public and private aspects of International Air Law, including the Chicago Convention 1944, Warsaw Convention 1929 and Montreal Convention 1999.

With the end of the COVID-19 pandemic in sight and the impending re-opening of national borders to cross-border flights, the Talk is intended to disseminate the knowledge of International Air Law to Members of the Malaysian Bar who would like to acquire knowledge of the same as part of their daily practice and, particularly to young Members of the Bar who may aspire to work in the aviation industry one day.
