Tuan Haji Awang Armadajaya started his career as a tutor at the Faculty of Social Sciences, University Malaysia Sarawak, where he taught the Constitutional Law, Malaysian Legal System, and Public International Law subjects. He later joined the Federal Judicial and Legal Service in 1995, serving as a Deputy Public Prosecutor/Senior Federal Counsel in various postings such as Kuching, Sibul, Putrajaya, Shah Alam, Bukit Aman and Kuala Lumpur.

From 2008 until 2018, he worked at the Appellate and Trial Division in Putrajaya, where the last position held was the Acting Head of the Appellate and Trial Division. In 2011, he was appointed as a Conducting Officer for the Royal Commission of Inquiry investigating the death of Teoh Beng Hock. He served a short stint as the Deputy Director-General of the Judicial and Legal Training Institute (ILKAP) in Bandar Baru Bangi in 2015. His last position in the civil service was as the Chairman of the Advisory Board, Prime Minister's Department, where he advised His Majesty, The Yang di-Pertuan Agong on Preventive Law detentions.

From May 2019 until May 2022, he served as a Judicial Commissioner of the High Court of Malaya. After completing his contract, he continued his career in law by practicing at Messrs. Hassahari & Partners, a legal firm located in Shah Alam.
